Beyond the Book: Intro to Literary Analysis & Discussion 7th-9th Nieman	**To earn high school credit, the student would need to complete course work for 45-50 min/5 days. One day takes place at Heritage & the homework assigned would need to be completed during the week. Ex. for PE classes, the student would need to continue to practice during the week for that class to earn course credit. However, a half credit can be given for 2-2.5 hours a week and then a full credit for more time spent. Most of the academic classes would give enough homework to guarantee credit. Ultimately, the decision to assign credit is the parents'. Junior High classes could be counted for high school credit if the student takes the class in 9th grade & does the appropriate amount of outside work. A Jr. High class might need to be combined with an additional class for high school credit. EX.--Jr. High Lit and Jr. High writing.
